Veterans treatment courts are alternative to incarceration for military veterans and service members whose involvement in the justice system is rooted in a substance use disorder, mental health disorder, or trauma. These courts connect veterans in crisis with local, state, and federal benefits and facilitate treatment services The Bozeman Veteran Eligible Treatment Services (VETS) Court is a voluntary 12-24 month program that uses a collaborative. evidence-based approach to treatment and rehabilitation

MISSION

Reduce crime, enhance public safety, save taxpayer costs, and enrich lives by facilitating sobriety, treating mental health conditions, improving social relationships, and promoting lifelong stability for veteran offenders in our community.

- Provide cost-effective alternatives to traditional incarceration and probation
- Offer a team-based approach to case management, goal-setting and accountability
- Ensure evidence-based policies and practices
- Increase access to health and behavioral health resources, including VA services

PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS

Judicial Supervision provides structure for change by offering both incentives and sanctions for accomplishments and missteps. Participants appear in court for review hearings twice monthly.

A Treatment Plan is co-developed by the treatment team and veteran and outlines substance use counseling, mental health counseling, and support group meeting goals.

Community Supervision includes random drug tests, meetings with a probation officer, and virtual home visits to help the veteran maintain their treatment while ensuring community safety.

Case Management Services to help the veteran follow the requirements of the treatment plan and find community resources.

A Mentor to support the veteran in finding resources in the community and navigating the VETS Court process.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Served or be actively serving in the United States military
- Treatment needs the court can satisfy Approved by the defense attorney, prosecutor, and judge
- Charge(s) offers the court sufficient jurisdiction
- Resides within or near Gallatin County or able to move upon acceptance
- At least 18 years old
